Adult education is workforce development. The Literacy & Learning Success Centers support adults in building their skills for life in the community, at home, and for careers. The learners who seek our services have highly diverse backgrounds with a wide range of knowledge, skills, and abilities. What they all have in common is a desire to grow.

We celebrate the success of our students—every success matters. For some students, learning how to write your name and address in a new language is a big success. For others, reclaiming a professional career is a big success. Every student's journey is a transformative experience, and we are honored to be part of that journey.

Between 2020 and 2022, we experienced a decline in student numbers in response to the pandemic. This year, student numbers are higher than ever. We are experiencing an unprecedented number of adults seeking services, which is challenging our capacity.

At the end of September, we hit 67% of the enrollment goal, and we have just entered the second quarter of the program year. To meet the moment, we will need additional resources, including teachers.

## **How Adult and Family Literacy Education Makes an Impact:**

- English language learners are important to the job market. Immigrants can grow our workforce. We provide free basic education classes where these adults can increase their English language proficiency, improve basic skills, and build a career plan. Highly skilled immigrants can reclaim their careers through in-demand jobs.
- Lack of a high school credential is a barrier for more than 46,000 working-age adults in our region. While many employers have waived the requirement for the short term, it will continue to be a barrier to accessing job training, post-secondary education, and career growth. We help adults attain their high school credentials so they can move into jobs and postsecondary education.
- Many of Pennsylvania's working-age adults lack basic digital literacy skills. The National Skills Coalition estimates that 1 in 3 workers struggle with digital literacy. Most jobs require some use of a computer, yet many working-

- age adults do not have digital skills. Investing in digital literacy ensures a competitive workforce and we are teaching adults these skills.
- Middle-skill jobs are the sweet spot. By 2024, 48% of job openings will be middle-skill, and 32% will be high-skill. We are helping adults build the skills they need to get trained for middle-skill jobs. Adult education is a key onramp for workers to reach middle-skill jobs.
- A national longitudinal study of adult education participants found that participation in at least 100 hours of adult education was correlated with a \$9,000 increase in annual earnings. The return on investment is clear. An adult and family literacy education graduate can typically earn close to \$10,000 more per year once they get their diploma.
